



The DP students had experience with the pressure of an end of course IB exam, and therefore, were prepared for an exam-based grading structure in college.







Facing the challenges of the 21st century requires deliberate effort to cultivate the competencies that students need to respond to the labour market. A Study on employability skills in the IBDP and IBCP curricula by the Center for Curriculum Redesign (January 2020) showed some of the competencies such as. communication, ethics, mindfulness and critical thinking are well embedded in the IB curricula.



The core components of the IB Diploma



The Extended Essay (EE)

- 4000 words academic essay
- offers the opportunity to investigate a research question of individual interest
- students develop independent research and writing skills expected at university

Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS)

- encourages students in artistic pursuits, sports and community service
- CAS experiences that cover seven learning outcomes and help students develop learner profile attributes.
- students work on a collaborative CAS project.

Theory of Knowledge (TOK)

- explores the nature of knowledge across disciplines
- encourages an appreciation of other cultural perspectives
- students are required to create an exhibition that explores how TOK manifests in the world around us.
- students are required to write an essay in response to one of the six prescribed titles that are issued by the IB.

The six subject groups at RWA



Group 1 Studies in Language and Literature

English A: Language and Literature, SS Self-taught language A

Group 2 Language Acquisition

Arabic/French/Spanish B OR ab initio, SS Self-taught language A or B

Group 3 Individuals and Societies

Business Management, Economics, *Environmental Systems and Societies*, Geography, Global Politics, History, Psychology

Group 4 Experimental Sciences

Biology, Chemistry, Computer Science, *Environmental Systems* and *Societies*, Sports, Exercise and Health Science and Physics

Group 5 Mathematics

Mathematics: Analysis and Approaches, Mathematics: Applications and Interpretations

Group 6 The Arts or an additional Group 3 or 4 subject

Theatre Arts, Visual Arts OR a second Group 3 or Group 4 subject



Specific guidance for subject groups





Group 1 Studies in Language and Literature

Only students in Language and Literature can opt for English A: Language and Literature Students in Language Acquisition may opt for SS Self-taught language A (not included in school fees)

Group 2 Language Acquisition

Phase 2	New Language B ab initio Self-taught Language B SL/HL	No requirements Not included in school fees
Phase 4	Language B SL Language B HL	Minimum grade 4 Minimum grade 6

Group 3 Individuals and Societies

Students may choose Business and Management and/or Economics at **SL only** if they have not taken these subjects in MYP.

Group 5 Mathematics

Only Maths extended students may opt for Maths AA HL Maths standard students may choose from Maths AA SL or Maths AI SL

IBDP Assessment Model



Number of subjects = 6

Maximum grade available = 7

42 points (6x7)

+

3 bonus points available (EE + TOK)

TOTAL = 45 points

- A final examination consisting of 2-3 papers that are externally set and marked for all courses.
- An internal assessment component (IA) in each of the six courses and TOK exhibition that are marked by teachers but moderated by IB. EE and TOK essay marked by IB.
- The IB Diploma is graded over 45 points.
- The grades awarded in each course range from 7 (highest) to 1 (lowest)
- To qualify for the IB Diploma
 - ✓ 24-point minimum total, AND
 - √ 12-point minimum in the three HL subjects



How did we do overall in May 2021?






Historical data for trends










Compared to historical data RWA has a pass rate between 93-100%

UAE MOE Equivalency requirements



Ministerial Decision No. (883/2019)

First Track (IB Diploma)

The student must successfully pass the Full IB Diploma Programme as per the International Baccalaureate requirements.

Second Track (IB Courses)

Students must successfully pass six (6) DP subjects while satisfying the following conditions:

- Achieve a minimum of 3 points in each subject.
- Achieve a minimum total point of 21.
- Subjects may be taken at SL or HL.
- DP subjects must include the following three (3) compulsory subjects:
 English, mathematics, and a science subject.
- Arab students must take Arabic A or Arabic B as one of the six subjects.
- For Muslim students Islamic Education is mandatory but may not be taken as one of six DP subjects.



For Engineering Math AA HL is a requirement.

For Medicine in many countries the science requirements include (Biology/ Chemistry).

Country

For Canada, Chemistry is a requirement for certain Engineering subjects.

For Netherlands/India three science subjects is a requirement for Medical programs.

For Canada many universities do not accept AISL for their courses.

Please note it is the student's responsibility to check the Course requirement for the chosen University!

Help students with a healthy diet, exercise and mental well being.




